STAY IN MAY

Fest digs into food, fitness, fugues, films

Stay in May refers to one county, but it's all over the map with event options, from food to health to dance and music.

Consider that an app-ed description. This year the festival of arts and culture is offering an iPhone and iPad app on its website, so you're never more than a click away from events that

are spread from Marco Island to Bonita Springs, including: » A regionally known artist painting to the tunes of cabaret favorites at a "A Night in Paris" (May 11, Rose History Auditorium on Marco Island)

» A morning of "Mindfulness Meditation" (Wednesday at the Shangri-La Spa in Bonita Springs).

There's even a festival within a festival: the Stay in May International Short Film Festival (7 p.m. April 30, May 3 and 7 in the Sheffield Theatre, 120 Moorings Park, \$15 each night).

"This is what we like. The essence of the festival is we want to offer new, different things across the broad spectrum of the arts," said Trey Farmer, president of the festi-

The film festival is part of that expansion, he said. Even its location, the Sheffield Theater at Moorings Park, will be new to festival goers because it is generally used

From country to classical, music is here

Music has been the cornerstone of the Stay in May Festival since its founding seven years ago, and it continues to be a big part of the music program, which actually launches in April, on Wednesday.

Let summer gold enrich yard

When it comes to summer in southern Florida, the first and most colorful flowering plant that comes to mind is the allamanda, known as

summer gold because of its brilliant yellow color. Just like the forsythia announces spring to our northern neighbors, the alllamanda heralds spring in southern Florida.

Allamanda (Allamanda cathartica), usually a shrub or vine, starts blooming in the spring and continues blooming throughout the year, except for its winter break. It is one of Florida's summerblooming plants that are easy to get established and that will grow in the sunny parts of our gardens. It is very showy with its bright yellow trumpet-

shaped flowers.

Allamanda's growth is regulated by pruning, just like everything else. It

tolerates our sandy so-called soil, and pests are usually not a problem. The only things allamanda does not like are frost and shade. It's drought-tolerant, salt-tolerant and can survive neglect. It comes in a shrub form and can be used as a ground cover or hedge. It is perfect for a fence or almost any sturdy struc-

One of my favorites is called cherries jubilee, with its pinkish-purple large trumpet-like flowers. It often is found growing around mailboxes. It is truly a showstopper — mine has been for almost 20 years.

All allamandas can be grown as container plants or spotted throughout a garden. There have been several new hybrids developed in the past couple of years, such as the deep red and purple flower, as well as one with a smaller

for private events. The films, chosen by local filmmaker-writer-director Judy Copeland, are still going through film festival competitions before their general release. One is concurrently in the Tribeca Film Festival in New York.

'These are films you can't see anywhere else except a major film festival," Farmer said. "Each will have a filmmaker to talk about the process. It's a really unique event.'

A new event is the pipe organ "crawl." Beginning at noon May 4, it will take people to four different buildings around the city to view some of its grandest pipe organs and hear their music. It's hosted by Michael Barone, star of the nationally syndicated radio program "Pipe Dreams."

Participants will get to talk to Barone and hear both him and church organists produce music that shows off each instrument. According to organizer Claudia Polzin, communications liaison for the festival, lists of the stops (the distinct sound sets) are offered for each, so the mysteries of something like a "spitzflote" can be explained on

Another event Polzin is particularly excited about is the "Top Chef High School" showcase, 7 p.m. May 2, that charges high school culinary teams to create an appetizer, a main course and a dessert under the watchful eye of their own culinary director and with helpful critiques from Chef Brian Roland. All of them this year will be built around the theme of a jazz song and explained to the audience, much like TV chef shows.

Come hungry, Polzin said. The audience will get to try it all. The event is a partnership among Collier County Public Schools, the FGCU Culinary Program, the Culinary and Hospitality Foundation of Southwest Florida and Roland, who has offered his own Venue

Naples, 13240 U.S. 41 N., North Naples, for the event (\$25).

Polzin said she was impressed with the program in the county schools.

'They're all run by individuals who are graduates of culinary institutes, so I can't wait to see what they're coming up with."

The schools participating this year are Barron Collier, Gulf Coast High School, Immokalee, Lorenzo Walker Institute of Technology and Palmetto Ridge High School.

Plan on some impromptu dancing when the Tokens take the stage at Naples Zoo to sing, appropriately, their hit,

"The Lion Sleeps Tonight," along with other '50s and '60s gems at 5:30 p.m. May 12 (\$37). The festival is partnering with the zoo to make this event a fundraiser for lions, which are an endangered species, Polzin said.

"So prior to concert opening, they will have keepers down by the lions. A painting is done by a lion that will be raffled off, and proceeds will go to conservation program for the lions,"

No word yet on whether the lions plan an expressionist or cubist look.




